Digitizing Diego Rivera's Detroit Industry Murals Original Sketches for an Online Gallery

Diego Rivera's Detroit Industry Murals, a series of iconic frescoes located in the Detroit Institute of Arts, stand as iconic testament to the intersection of art, history, and industry in the 20th century. However, the accessibility of original sketches in uncovering Rivera's creative process have remained a challenge. This project aims to bridge this gap by scanning and digitizing the 5-10 original sketches from a private collection which was only presented at the Diego Rivera Mural Museum as part of "Diego Rivera: Revisions of North America" special exhibition from July 8 to October 30, 2016. By making these sketches available in an online gallery, this project aims to bridge the divide between traditional art curation and the digital humanities, ensuring that the sketches are not confined to the physical limitations of a museum.
